

## YOUTH DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

The **AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY** program is a history and cultural education curriculum for students in 6th-12th grade. Participants meet weekly after school with their team leader for lessons, presentations and other activities. Teams compete in several local competitions using the Brain Game format.



**BEAUTILLION MILITAIRE** is a college readiness and rite of passage for young men in 11th-12th grade and is a joint venture with Jack and Jill of America. The program increases students' academic achievement, personal development, civic engagement, ethnic pride, and leadership skills.



High School students in the **FINANCIAL LITERACY** program meet weekly with a University of Indianapolis professor and their mentors to learn about managing and investing money. Pairs of students develop, monitor, and assess an investment portfolio then compete in a portfolio presentation competition.



**SCHOLASTIC SPORTS** is a mentoring program for 3rd-5th graders that combines life skills development with the sports of Basketball and Track. Students are rewarded and recognized based on academic effort, attendance and behavior rather than athletic ability alone.



The **SUMMER ACADEMY** is a 7-week summer program for students in K-8th grade. In partnership with St. Vincent Unity Development Center and GEO Foundation, the Academy provides students with a balance of academic classes and a variety of cultural and recreational activities in an effort to decrease knowledge loss over the summer.



In 2008, the United Way of Central Indiana selected The 100 to provide a new **TEAM MENTORING** program to middle school boys in IPS schools on the near East side. Small groups of 5th and 6th grade boys meet weekly with male mentors during their lunch period. The mentors and mentees explore the roles and responsibilities of being a man of distinction through structured discussions and activities.

- Though the organization is named 100 Black Men, approximately 45% of youth served by our programs are female, and 25% are not African American.

## ABOUT THE 100

The concept of 100 Black Men grew from the turbulent conditions of the 1960s when a group of concerned African-American men began to explore ways to improve their community. In 1963, one-hundred black men representing a cross-section of New York City forged a leadership alliance to help direct their community through troubled times. To ensure the quality of life in their communities the group focused their resources on youth development and adopted the name, 100 Black Men Inc., as a sign of solidarity. Today, 100 Black Men of America is based in Atlanta, Georgia and has more than 100 chapters world-wide.

Founded locally in 1984, 100 Black Men of Indianapolis is a youth development, non-profit organization that serves more than 800 Indianapolis area youth each year through mentoring-based, educational programs. The 100 is comprised of more than 130 members of diverse backgrounds and experiences with a common commitment to help children. Our members exemplify our motto, *What They See is What They'll Be*, by volunteering as role models and mentors for youth involved in The 100's programs.

The 100 conducts 6 programs for young people in K-12th grades that focus on mentoring, education and leadership development. Our programs impact students' personal development and academic achievement. The majority of students involved in our programs display increased self-esteem, personal responsibility, and motivation to succeed in school.
