The 100 Black Men of Indianapolis is a youth development organization that serves more than 700 youth each year through six mentoring-based educational programs. Founded locally in 1984, 100 Black Men of Indianapolis is comprised of 130 members of diverse backgrounds and experiences with a common commitment to help children. We partner with local schools, universities, and other organizations to provide programs that encourage personal development, academic growth, and basic life skills in order to positively impact the mental, physical, moral and spiritual development of young people.

100 Black Men currently has several youth programs underway in need of both male and female volunteers. Training and curriculum materials will be provided. An hour a week is all it takes to impact the life of a child.

TEAM MENTORING



The United Way of Central Indiana selected The 100 Black Men of Indianapolis to provide the **TEAM MENTORING PROGRAM** to male students in five IPS schools on the near-east side of Indianapolis. We service all male 5th and 6th grade students for one hour weekly. The program is unique because it takes a “team” approach to mentoring. It pairs two mentors with a group of seven young men in the 5th and 6th grade. Our curriculum helps guide the mentors work with each young man as they discuss the principals of manhood. AFRICAN-AMERICAN HISTORY & SCHOLASTIC SPORTS

Male and female volunteers are needed to support students in our Scholastic Sports and African American History programs. Teams generally meet once a week after school with competitions on Saturdays 2-3 times per year.

The **African-American History** program is a history and cultural education curriculum designed to enhance the study of African-American history among students in 6th – 12th grade. Students meet weekly after school with their team leader. Teams compete in city-wide competitions using the Brain Game format. We need volunteers to help students prepare for competitions. The **Scholastic Sports** program blends mentoring with the sport of Basketball. The program addresses the need for positive recreational activities that reinforce personal responsibility, accountability, discipline, leadership skills and teamwork. Students are rewarded and recognized based on academic effort, attendance and behavior rather than athletic ability. We need volunteers to mentor and coach 3rd – 5th grade students in the program.
